The River Stour Trust (RST) is a registered charity, led by volunteers dedicated to preserving the right to navigate the River Stour (between Sudbury, Suffolk to Manningtree, Essex).

The Suffolk & Essex River Stour was one of the country's earliest statutory Navigations following an Act of Parliament in 1705 during the reign of Queen Anne.

RST was set up on 12th September 1968 and successfully fought a proposed closure of the navigation on this historic river. A public right of navigation remains today and is administered by the Environment Agency. RST is dedicated to protecting and enhancing the right of the public to navigate the River Stour. Many of the locks have disappeared but through navigation (a distance of approximately 25miles/37km) is achievable by smaller craft that can be portaged.

Sudbury to the Sea has been an important event on the RST calendar since the 1970s when a small group of paddlers would take to the water to ensure the Navigation remained in use. It was rebranded as Sudbury to the Sea (S2C) in 2005 with maximum attendance set at 300 craft.

We share our knowledge and enjoyment about the river's history, present and future through various activities including boat trips, events and educational activities.

We could not exist without our members and supporters. This river has a long history, and you are contributing towards preserving the Stour for everyone to enjoy for years to come.









# **2024 S2C RULES**

- 1) Entry denotes acceptance of these rules by all participants for the duration of the event.
- 2) All participants will wear a life preserver/buoyancy aid.
- 3) Any craft used during the event must be registered for navigational use i.e. 'licensed' to paddle the river. This must cover the duration of the event and is achieved by one of the options below:
  - a) Paddle UK 'on the water' membership (held by at least one participant in the craft).
  - b) Environment Agency craft registration (per craft).
  - c) S2C ticket with 'Paddle Pass'.
  - d) Hire of S2C Official Hire Partner craft.
- 4) Please ensure you can verify your craft is registered for navigational use. Any craft entry determined to be without valid and acceptable proof during the event must purchase an EA craft registration.
  - a) Please note: purchases of EA Craft Registration are refundable (less £3 admin fee) should valid and acceptable proof of alternative registration be presented within 3 days after the event.
- 5) All participants must be competent and confident in handling their craft. A responsible adult must accompany children either by sharing a craft or paddling alongside.
- 6) We advise participants use the official portages and keep clear of weirs and sluices. You might find it useful if your craft has a painter (a rope that is attached to the bow of a boat).
- 7) All participants must be prepared, fit and able enough to use the portages. Physical assistance from our volunteer marshals or others cannot be expected.
- 8) Most portages are over private property <u>do not trespass</u>. Only portage at the official portage points (as outlined in 'S2C Route' document, EA Navigation map and route signage).
- 9) You are advised to keep in sight of other craft as far as is possible. Our designated sweepers are the last to depart and will adhere to the checkpoint departure times.
- 10) Participants must check in at each and every checkpoint. This is essential, as failure to do so could result in a search being made. If you cannot leave a checkpoint by the designated time, you are deemed to have withdrawn from the event.

- 11) If you are choosing to withdraw from the event:
  - a) At a checkpoint: please ensure the checkpoint marshal is notified before you leave.
  - b) An unmarshalled location: contact our emergency number/s as soon as possible.
- **12)** Unfortunately, there are no refunds if you withdraw before or during the event.
- 13) Please follow advice and guidance to help ensure a safe and enjoyable event for everyone.

  Anti-social and/or drunken behaviour will not be tolerated and can lead to expulsion from the event.
- **14)** Watch out for submerged obstructions or other hazards. Report any urgent problems or incidents to our emergency number/s. If possible, pinpoint location using What3Words app.
- be aware of this potentially fatal infection. Transmission is usually through an open wound or abrasion but can also be coursed by ingestion of contaminated water. Symptoms are often akin to flu symptoms and, if untreated, can be fatal. If you feel ill after paddling, you should tell your doctor as soon as possible and let them know where and when you have been on the water.
- 16) Please take every opportunity to wash your hands properly with soap and water. Although the usual toilet and hand washing facilities will be available at the checkpoints; we suggest that all participants also bring along their own hand sanitiser gel.
- 17) There will be staggered time slots for launching on Saturday morning to help reduce overcrowding and expedite the registration process. Please aim to arrive 10 minutes before your launch timeslot so we can efficiently manage this process. Delays are possible if you arrive outside your timeslot.
- 18) Remember that boating is an 'assumed risk' sport you paddle at your own risk. The River Stour Trust will make every effort to assist you to enjoy this event however no liability can be accepted for any loss, injury, or damage, however caused.

- 20) The River Stour Trust reserves the right to cancel or postpone the event if circumstances beyond our reasonable control will negatively impact on safety or viability of the event.

#### **OPTION 1 - S2C CAMPING AREA**

Top field is reserved for S2C - campfires provided by campsite allowed - dogs permitted

- S2C pitches are pre-arranged do not call to book!
- CASH ONLY! The campsite warden will visit to check you in and tag your pitch.
- On Friday, access to set up in the S2C camping area is permitted for those wishing to set up in advance. Fee applies whether the pitch is occupied or not.

### **S2C Pitch Fees (tent/camper/caravan):**

- £20 per <u>occupied</u> pitch (i.e. staying overnight)
- £10 per <u>unoccupied</u> pitch (i.e. set up only not sleeping overnight)

#### **Other Fees:**

- £5 per dog (must be kept on leads and cleaned up after)
- £22 'campfire bundle' (2x bags of logs, 1x fire pit, 2x kindling & firelighters, bucket & grill) Only campfires provided by the campsite are permitted until 11pm

#### **OPTION 2 - MAIN CAMPSITE**

Access is permitted for those wishing to set up in advance for convenience (pitch fee applies whether you are staying there or not). Please adhere to on-site signage and set up in the top field (you pass alongside it when driving down the campsite access road).

A cuppa and treat awaits all paddlers upon arrival. Please let us know in advance about any food allergies or dietary requirements so can do our best to accommodate you.

# **FRIDAY 13 SEP**

OPTIONAL CRAFT DROP OFF - The Granary, Quay Lane, Sudbury, CO10 2AN - ///gradually.bricks.stay
4:30pm-7:30pm - Optional drop off your craft and equipment for overnight storage. Our volunteers will greet you. Take care driving down Quay Lane as it can be quite tight. Toilets on site.

OPTIONAL - Rushbanks Campsite, Bures Road, Wissington, CO6 4NA - ///unloading.clinic.caravans
You can either camp tonight (occupied pitch) or simply set up/leave a vehicle ahead of your arrival by river
on Saturday (unoccupied pitch). Please note: Only use the Top Field which is designated for S2C (it's the
area alongside the campsite access road). Adhere to on-site signage. Toilets on site.

## **SATURDAY 14 SEP**

## START @ SUDBURY - 8am-10:30am - Event Registration - The Granary

Each craft is allocated a launch time slot to help manage flow of traffic off and on the river. We are selling hot/cold drinks, bacon/vegi sausage butties and can fill up water bottles. Toilets on site.

Take care driving down Quay Lane as it can be quite tight. It is preferred that vehicles leave Quay Lane car park after drop off to minimise congestion. The nearest long stay car park is at Station Road (AKA Kingfisher Car Park near railway station/Waitrose, 5-10 min walk to Granary). Or park at the campsite in the Top Field which is designated for S2C (it's located alongside the campsite access road – follow on site signage).

\*\*It's about 3 hours paddling before the Bures checkpoint & lunch stop\*\*

CHECKPOINT & LUNCH - BURES Recreation Ground, CO8 5BX ///safe.ringers.calm

Make sure to check in when you arrive and check out when you depart! Small, free car park adjacent to recreation ground (also nearest road exit) with a portaloo (or use toilets in Bures Common barn). We are expecting Vitalina's Icecreams to visit. A short 5-minute walk takes you to the Bures Farmers Market (10am-1pm) on Bures Common. Hot and cold drinks (and toilets) are available in the barn. Stalls are selling a variety of fabulous local farm produce, drinks and bakery goodies. A range of food stalls offering burgers, hot dogs, samosas, bahjis, sausage rolls and cakes as well as fruit and veg to eat on the go! There are also several pubs and small shops (such as the deli over the road from the Common).

DAY 1 END - WISSINGTON Rushbanks Campsite, CO6 4NA ///unloading.clinic.caravans

We recommend <u>Nayland Anchor Inn</u> who are offering S2Cers a 10% discount (flash your S2C wristband, pre-booking is advisable!). A shuttle bus service between campsite and Anchor has been arranged (refer to 'SHUTTLE BUS' section).

CHECKPOINT & LUNCH – STRATFORD ST MARY Swan Inn, CO7 6JR – ///loudly.stems.cube
Checkpoint is at the River Garden (small strip of grassed area adjacent to the Swan Inn). The pub is holding a mini beer festival with food available for S2Cers. Toilet facilities available inside pub. We are expecting Vitalina's Icecreams to visit.

FINISH - CATTAWADE Picnic Site, Darwin Close, CO11 1QW - ///movement.fishery.landscape

## EVENT START POINT - THE GRANARY, CO10 2AN (8:00am-10:00am)





The registration will open at 8am. Entry List is finalised ahead of the event with Saturday launch time slots and entry numbers allocated for each craft.

Registration requires confirming details for the craft entry - participant names, onboard mobile, emergency contact and presenting proof of how craft is registered for navigational use on the river. Slap on your S2C wristband, affix your craft entry number sticker in a place that will be visible to the riverside checkpoint marshals and off you go!

Hot drinks, bacon (or vegi sausage) sandwich and water bottle filling available in tea room. Take a comfort break then set off via the jetty next to the slipway.





Portage and Lock are on the left fork past the weir. Lock will be operated **Great Cornard** for a limited period. Treat weir with caution, beware of the side jet at high water levels.



Henny Weir \*\*DO NOT SHOOT WEIR - known blockages that could trap you!\*\* Portage on left via platforms to bypass blockages. Do NOT enter Mill Pool straight ahead - strictly private!

Please do not stop at Henny Swan – you've only just started your paddle and you need to get to Bures in time for lunch treats at the Farmer's Market (10am-1pm) as well as leaving checkpoint on time!



**Henny Regulator** 0.5 metre drop, portage on the left bank.



Pitmire (Daws Hall) Landing stage on left. Carry around weir to launch from landing stage. Take left hand channel below portage. Beware of concrete block immediately after footbridge. The right bank is a nature reserve - strictly private! Paddle around the island and DO NOT paddle under the bridge due to submerged remnants of old lock (bricks and metal rods) damaging your boat and/or you!



**Lamarsh Regulator** Portage on left, via platforms.



\*\*It's about 3 hours paddling before the Bures checkpoint & lunch stop \*\*

# CHECKPOINT @ BURES RECREATION GROUND, CO8 5BX \*DEPART BY 2:30PM\*



At Bures, exit via landing stage on the left-hand bank. Please check in before stopping for lunch!



We are expecting Vitalina's Icecream Van to visit and a 5-minute walk takes you to the Bures Farmers Market (10am-1pm) on Bures Common. Hot and cold drinks (and toilets) are available in the barn. Stalls are selling a variety of fabulous local farm produce, drinks and bakery goodies. A range of food stalls offering burgers, hot dogs, samosas, bahjis, sausage rolls and cakes as well as fruit and veg to eat on the go! There are also several pubs and small shops (such as the deli over the road from the Common). Check out by 2:30pm deadline.



**Bures Mill** Portage at platform on the right and over bank. DO NOT attempt to use the impassable fish bypass which is 100 metres upstream of the portage. Avoid sluice at all costs.



Portage is accessed by taking the right fork before the weir to the landing stage. Wormingford Mill Follow fenced path through private garden. Steps and lower jetty may be slippery. Do not pass through the old lock chamber as this is highly dangerous.





DAY 1 FINISH POINT - WISSINGTON @ Rushbanks Campsite, CO6 4NA



Please check in upon arrival! Enjoy a well-deserved cuppa and treat from our refreshments area located near the checkpoint by sunset corner. If you're camping, then you might like to visit somewhere local? Nayland Anchor Inn are offering 10% discount to S2Cers – flash your S2C wristband (pre-booking is advisable!). Shuttle bus service between campsite and Anchor Inn (refer to 'SHUTTLE BUS' section).










## DAY 2 START POINT @ Rushbanks Campsite, CO6 4NA \*Checkout 8am-10:00am\*





Wissington Mill A triple weir - must be portaged. Landing stage on right bank behind reeds then down steep steps to landing stage. **Do NOT** portage left.



Turn left before the large EA sluice ahead to pass through the tunnel under the A134. There are portage platforms on the right to pass the weir.



TEMPORARY DIVERTED PORTAGE ROUTE \*S2C Marshals in attendance\* **Boxted Mill** Portage on left, follow marked route through private garden. DO NOT go down steps into Mill Pool because that section of the navigation is closed. Follow signage through the gates leading onto the closed road. Turn right towards the bridge and then left through gap in hedge to access the river here. This portage crosses a private garden- it is not a toilet, lunch stop and no scrumping! Keep clear of sluice.



Langham Flumes A twin concrete channel full width of the river. Landing stage on right could be partially hidden by reeds. Rocks below flumes create fast flowing water past portage jetty where water is deep. Beyond here there are shallows and woody debris fish habitats.



#### CHECKPOINT @ STRATFORD ST MARY, CO7 6JR \*DEPART BY 3:00PM\*



AT STRATFORD ST MARY - Please check in upon arrival! Take the left fork to visit the checkpoint at River Garden (opposite the pub) or there is limited space here to leave craft stored whilst you stop for lunch and toilet facilities.



We are expecting Vitalina's Icecream Van to visit. The pub is holding a mini beer festival with food available for S2Cers. Toilet facilities available inside.



Paddle past the lock to portage on the right at the end of the lock island but remember to make sure you have checked in and out!

### Check out by 3.00 pm deadline.





**Dedham Lock** Portage jetty on left before Lock Cottage. Carry through the field behind Lock Cottage to re-launch in Mill Pond. The lock is being restored so should be in use for S2C 2025!



Flatford Lock, CO7 6UL The lock will be operated for a limited period. Portage on right before lock, past the lock to jetty beyond the low wall. If stopping, please do not leave craft in the way of others! You can enjoy your own food and/or visit Flatford NT Tea Room. Toilets in NT tearoom and public toilets as signposted.




Judas Gap About 1 mile downstream is a barrage across the river. Take left-hand channel.
